Over the next few weeks, we're setting aside time to look at the heart of who we are as a church and who God is calling us to be.

Inside this booklet are daily devotionals for you to do by yourself or with your Life Group throughout the week. Each devotional takes only a few minutes and will help you understand your own calling, purpose and God's plan for your life!

SOAP Method

This book includes daily devotions that utilize the SOAP method. This is just one approach for how to study the Bible, but we believe it is a powerful tool to helping you better understand the Bible.

S = Scripture

From the verses you read, take a moment to write out a scripture or two that stood out to you.

O = Observation

The goal is to dig, think and mediate. Write out things that stood out to you, any commands to follow, promises to hold onto or what is taking place in the passage.

A = Application

Think of a real life way you can live this out. Ask how this passage applies to your life today? How can you live in light of this truth?

P = Prayer

Respond to the passage in prayer. Ask God to help you apply this Scripture to your life, and spend time listening to what He may be telling you.



WEEK ONE

WE EXIST TO GLORIFY GOD AND TO DO HIS WILL

LIFE GROUP DISCUSSION

Key Passage: Joshua 24:14–28 Take some time to read through the passage together as a group. Below is space for you to write down any thoughts, questions or big takeaways from your Life Group discussion.

Read Luke 2:8-21

SCRIPTURE
Write out one or two verses that stood out to you.
OBSERVATION Write out things that stood out to you, any commands to follow, promises to hold onto or things that at taking place in the passage.

But the angel said to them, "Don't be afraid, for look, I proclaim to you good news of great joy that will be for all the people: Today in the city of David a Savior was born for you, who is the Messiah, the Lord.

LUKE 2:10-11 (CSB)



Write out ways you can begin living this out today. How does this passage apply to your life? How are you going to live differently because of the truth of God's Word?		

This passage comes from the story of the shepherds visiting the manger on the night Jesus was born. What was their response to this great miracle? They glorified God and praised Him. Our response to God and His goodness should always be to glorify Him.

We are to live our lives for the glory of God. We don't live for our glory but for God's. Over and over, we see people in the New Testament responding to the miracles of Jesus by glorifying God. That should be our response to the miracle of salvation God gives to us. We live to bring glory to Him!

PRAYER

Today, thank God for what he has done for you. If you have trusted Him for salvation, thank Him for that great and miraculous gift. Ask Him to help you live a life that brings glory to Him rather than to yourself.

Read 1 Corinthians 6:19-20

SCRIPTURE
Write out one or two verses that stood out to you.
OBSERVATION Write out things that stood out to you, any commands to follow, promises to hold onto or things that at taking place in the passage.

Don't you know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, whom you have from God? You are not your own, for you were bought at a price. So glorify God with your body.

1 CORINTHIANS 6:19-20 (CSB)



APPLICATION Write out ways you can begin living this out today. How does this passage apply to your life? How are you going to live differently because of the truth of God's Word?

Believers have new ownership. We were bought by the blood of Jesus and made new, forgiven of sins and adopted into His family. How do we respond? We glorify God with our bodies.

God wants you to bring glory to Himself by what you do, how you act, where you go and how you think. You are to use your body as a means of bringing glory to His name. You are to use your time, energy and effort for more than yourself. You are to use those things as a means of praising your great Savior. Use your body for its greatest purpose, and glorify God through your life.

PRAYER

Ask the Lord to use your body to bring glory to Himself. Ask Him to use your hands, your feet, your tongue, and your mind to do the right things and to help others see Christ in you today.

Read Psalm 119:10-12

Write out ways you can begin living this out today. How does this passage apply to your life? How are you going to live differently because of the truth of God's Word?		

One of the reasons we read the Bible is because it teaches us how to obey the Lord and do His will. Through it we learn what God wants us to do, what He wants us to avoid and how He wants us to live.

God's Word is a great gift, and we should treasure it so much that we read it, learn it, and meditate on it. Doing this also helps us to avoid the pitfalls of sin. As you read God's Word, you learn more of what God wants you to do and how he wants you to live. As you read the Bible, ask God to help you put into practice what He is teaching you to do. Be sure to treasure the truths that are given for your benefit!

PRAYER

Ask the Lord to teach you to obey His Word as you read His Word. Ask Him to help you today to both learn and obey what He wants you to do.

Read James 1:22-25

But the one who looks intently into the perfect law of freedom and perseveres in it, and is not a forgetful hearer but a doer who works—this person will be blessed in what he does.

APPLICATION Write out ways you can begin living this out today. How does this passage apply to your life? How are you going to live differently because of the truth of God's Word?	
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It is great to hear the Word of God on Sunday night, in Life Groups and in your daily Bible reading. But hearing it is not enough. We must learn to put the truth into practice. We need to be doers of the Word as well as hearers.

We hear the Bible for a purpose, and that purpose is to live out the Bible. We apply the Word of God to our lives so that we begin to live as He wants us to live. Don't just receive information like you are going to school, but choose to be a DOER! Live out your faith today!

PRAYER

Ask God to show you what specific things He wants you to do today – be kind, learn patience, change a habit, apologize for a wrong, etc. Today, ask Him to help you to do what He teaches you to do.

Read Ephesians 2:8-10

For you are saved by grace through faith, and this is not from yourselves; it is God's gift— not from works, so that no one can boast.

APPLICATION Write out ways you can begin living this out today. How does this passage apply to your life? How are you going to live differently because of the truth of God's Word?

God saved you to do good works. You are not saved by good works, but you are saved for good works. We bring glory to our Lord when we do the things he saved us to do. God wants you to serve, minister and have an impact for him.

He will help you to see what he wants you to do as you say "yes" to Him this week. Our devotional verse reminds us that God has already prepared good works for us to do – we just need to be willing to do His will and follow His lead.

PRAYER

Say "yes" to God's will for you as you pray. Tell Him that you are willing to do what He wants you to do today. Ask Him to guide you to live the life He saved you to live.

WE ARE GOD-CENTERED

Key Passage: Matthew 6:1–8 Take some time to read through the passage together as a group. Below is space for you to write down any thoughts, questions or big takeaways from your Life Group discussion.

Read Romans 12:1-2

SCRIPTURE
Write out one or two verses that stood out to you.
OBSERVATION Write out things that stood out to you, any commands to follow, promises to hold onto or things that artaking place in the passage.

Therefore, brothers and sisters, in view of the mercies of God, I urge you to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God; this is your true worship.

ROMANS 12:1 (CSB)



PPLICATION ite out ways you can begin living this out today. How does this passage apply to your life? How out going to live differently because of the truth of God's Word?	are

This passage contains the elements of true worship. God has given us what we don't deserve: eternal love, eternal grace, the Holy Spirit, everlasting peace, eternal joy, saving faith and the list goes on and on!

Presenting our bodies means giving to God all of ourselves – our hearts, minds, hands, thoughts, and attitudes. But how?

We renew our minds daily by cleansing them of the world's "wisdom" and replacing it with true wisdom that comes from God through His Word, the Bible. Worship saves us from being self-centered and makes us God-centered. You were created to live in a relationship with God!

PRAYER

Ask God to help you worship Him, not just on Sundays, but every day this week.

Read Romans 8:14-16

SCRIPTURE Write out one or two verses that stood out to you.
OBSERVATION Write out things that stood out to you, any commands to follow, promises to hold onto or things that ar taking place in the passage.

For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear.
Instead, you received the Spirit of adoption, by whom we cry out,
"Abba, Father!"

ROMANS 8:15 (CSB)



Write out ways you can begin living this out today. How does this passage apply to your life? How are you going to live differently because of the truth of God's Word?

"The starting point for approaching God as Christ-followers is summed up in this single word: Father. Because that word is loaded with preconceived notions for all of us, depending on our relationships with our earthly fathers, praying in this way can be either extraordinarily comforting or extraordinarily problematic. Part of our growth in Christ, as well as our growth in prayer, involves recovering the meaning of this word as it's applied to God." – Steve Gains

Our sin separates us from God. The Bible declares that apart, from Christ, we are God's enemies (Romans 5:10) and in opposition to Him. But when we place our faith in Jesus Christ (the One we once opposed) becomes our Heavenly Father!

PRAYER

Pray and speak to God as a loving Father. He desperately wants to hear your heart, pain, struggles and praises like any father who is close to his child would.

Read Matthew 6:9, Isaiah 6:1-4

SCRIPTURE

OBSERVATION
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Write out things that stood out to you, any commands to follow, promises to hold onto or things that are taking place in the passage.

Therefore, you should pray like this: Our Father in heaven, your name be honored as holy.

Matthew 6:9 (CSB)



PPLICATION te out ways you can begin living this out today. How does this passage apply to your life? How are going to live differently because of the truth of God's Word?	

Holy means set apart. God's holiness is a description of His "otherness," unlike any created being and completely absent of even a trace of sin (James 1:13; Hebrews 6:18).

When we pray for God's name to be honored as holy, we're joining a call to worship God that even now is ringing throughout the heavens! That's what the prophet Isaiah encountered as he was taken up in a vision and saw the Lord, high and exalted, seated on His throne.

PRAYER

Ask God to help your prayers focus more on God's will for your life. Pray that God would show you how He wants you to apply the truths contained in today's devotional to your life this week.

Read Matthew 6:10; Luke 9:23-24

Your kingdom come. Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

APPLICATION Write out ways you can begin living this out today. How does this passage apply to your life? How are you going to live differently because of the truth of God's Word?

When we pray for God's kingdom to come and for His will to be done we're praying for our submission to Jesus as Lord. We are praying that our priorities would come into alignment with God's priorities.

We pray for things that matter to God.

PRAYER

Ask God to help your prayers focus more on God's will for your life. Pray that God would show you how He wants you to apply the truths contained in today's devotional to your life this week.

Read Matthew 6:11; Phil. 4:19

APPLICATION Write out ways you can begin living this out today. How does this passage apply to your life? How are you going to live differently because of the truth of God's Word?	
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When we ask God to "give us today our daily bread," we acknowledge that only God can fulfill all our needs and satisfy us each day. But can we trust God to meet our needs? Read Philippians 4:19 again.

God can be trusted to provide all our needs. We know this through our past experiences because He has given us everything we need. But we also know this because He has ultimately provided for our greatest need through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. In the abundance of our society, we can easily forget just how weak and needy we are apart from Christ. When Jesus taught us to ask for daily bread, He is teaching us to trust and rely on God daily.

PRAYER

Thank God for His provision in your life. Count your blessings today. Ask God to search your heart and reveal if there are things or people in your life that you are worshiping in place of Him? Ask God to help you make Him the center of your life.

Read Matthew 5:43-44

SCRIPTURE
Write out one or two verses that stood out to you.
OBSERVATION Write out things that stood out to you, any commands to follow, promises to hold onto or things that ar taking place in the passage.

"You have heard that it was said, Love your neighbor and hate your enemy. But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you..."

Matthew 5:43–44 (CSB)



APPLICATION Write out ways you can begin living this out today. How does this passage apply to your life? How are you going to live differently because of the truth of God's Word?

These two verses have nothing to do with the topic of reading the Bible, and yet they demonstrate wonderfully why the Bible is worth reading. The Bible is different from any other book that has ever been written.

Love my enemies? I don't even like people at my school.

The Bible is different because through Christ, it calls us to be different. When the world would hate, God's Word commands us to love. Where the world would seek revenge, God's Word tells us to pray for those who persecute us. Realize how wonderfully unique Scripture is. Give it your time this week.

PRAYER

Pray that God shows you how to include Scripture reading into your daily life

Read James 1:19

We live in a world where the loudest people often get the most attention. Our world justifies anger, payback and giving people a "piece of our mind." Think about how popular social media posts have become if they include insults about someone or complaints about something.

God calls us to be different. God calls us to be patient listeners who hear other people and speak with understanding and grace. The Bible is different, and it calls us to be different. This week, practice being slow to speak, slow to anger, and quick to listen to others.

PRAYER

Pray that God motivates you to start reading or continue to read God's Word. Try to spend just 15 minutes a day in the Word. Pray that God would also help you to be a better listener.

Read James 1:27

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Have you ever considered how quickly and easily the world will cast aside the defenseless? If you do not have a heart for the vulnerable both in and out of the womb, then listen to what the Word of God has to say.

The word "religion" often conjures up negative thoughts about death, faith and the church. However, the Greek word for religion (*thrēskeia*) means to worship.

Pure worship before God includes looking after orphans and widows. God calls us to love others who cannot offer anything in return. The Bible is different, and the Bible calls us to be different. Fall in love with this marvelous book, the Bible.

PRAYER

Pray that God will help you stick to a Bible reading plan. Pray that God will help you focus during your Bible reading and keep you from reading just to "check off a box."

Read James 3:9-10

SCRIPTURE

OBSERVATION Write out things that stood out to you, any commands to follow, promises to hold onto or things that ar taking place in the passage.

"With the tongue we bless our Lord and Father, and with it we curse people who are made in God's likeness. Blessing and cursing come out of the same mouth. My brothers and sisters, these things should not be this way."

APPLICATION Write out ways you can begin living this out today. How does this passage apply to your life? How are ou going to live differently because of the truth of God's Word?	

Do you struggle with gossip or cutting others down? Do you often talk about people behind their backs?

Hear what God's Word calls you to in this passage. The people you like the least and want to talk poorly about the most are God's creation. They are made in His image.

Use your speech to build others up, remembering that God created them and sent His Son to die to save them. The person who you get along with the least in the world is a person God loves. Love them with His love and look at them from His perspective. Choose to bless others.

PRAYER

Pray that God would give you excitement to continue learning His truths. Pray that God would help you to care for others instead of tearing them down or gossiping about them.

Read James 1:21

Don't let the length of the Bible discourage you. It is not meant to be consumed in one sitting. Scripture is a lifetime endeavor, but it is an endeavor that we all must start at some point. If you were not already a faithful reader, use this study as your starting point.

The Bible is the most important book ever written. It is a love letter from a holy, loving, just, and all-powerful God to a sinful, limited, starving people — us. God's Word is for YOU. It can change your life and save your soul. There is nothing like it.

PRAYER

Pray that God's Word catches fire in your heart. Pray that you will study with increasing expectations, humility, submission and thanksgiving.

Key Passage: Philippians 3:12–14, 3:20–21 Take some time to read through the passage together as a group. Below is space for you to write down any thoughts, questions or big takeaways from your Life Group discussion.

Read Philippians 3:12

SCRIPTURE

OBSERVATION Write out things that stood out to you, any commands to follow, promises to hold onto or things that artaking place in the passage.

"Not that I have already reached the goal or am already perfect, but I make every effort to take hold of it because I also have been taken hold of by Christ Jesus."

Philipians 3:12 (CSB)



APPLICATION Write out ways you can begin living this out today. How does this passage apply to your life? How are you going to live differently because of the truth of God's Word?

Each year, 22 of the world's best surfers compete at various international beaches. They surf when it is hot and when it is chilly. They surf on their off time when there are no competitions and with no one watching. Their love of surfing consumes them. In the predawn darkness of each surfing contest, they can be found surfing among the locals. Surfing has "taken hold" of them.

Like champion surfers who surf for the love of it, serve God because you love Him. Most days, we enter the "water" we call life and He gets the glory, but some days we linger on life's shore as spectators. Strive to serve Him each day, regardless of the circumstances, because you love Him and because He has "taken hold" of you!

PRAYER

Ask God to help you serve Him because you love Him and not merely out of obligation.

Read James 1:5

Sometimes, as believers, our lives are filled with confusion.

We focus on a dilemma we cannot solve. We try various solutions with no success. We ask friends, and they have no better answers than our own. Nothing works until we focus on Jesus and pray.

Prayer brings clarity during confusion and uncertainty. When we pray, God helps encourage and strengthen us. God also helps give us wisdom in hard times.

PRAYER

Ask God to remind you to look to Him for answers and solutions to life's problems.

What problem or difficulty are you facing today in your life? Stop, pray, and ask God for His help in bringing clarity and a solution.

PRAYER

Pray that others will see Jesus in you, not only on Sunday but every day.

Despite the differences in our nation, we are all citizens of the same country. We have the same "home" so to speak.

If we've confessed Christ as Lord and Savior of our lives (Romans 10:9), then one day, we will enter into our eternal home. People with every background, nationality, language will be there! Despite our differences, if we are in Christ, we are citizens of Heaven. Remember – this earth is not your forever home! Live for the Kingdom of Heaven that will never fade.

PRAYER

Ask God to help you keep your eyes fixed upward and live your life knowing that your "citizenship is in heaven."

WE ARE OUTWARD-FOCUSED

LIFE GROUP DISCUSSION

Key Passage: Luke 10:25–29, 30–37 Take some time to read through the passage together as a group. Below is space for you to write down any thoughts, questions or big takeaways from your Life Group discussion.

Read Nehemiah 2:1-12

"I got up at night and took a few men with me. I didn't tell anyone what my God had laid on my heart to do for Jerusalem. The only animal I took[a] was the one I was riding."

Nehemiah 2:12 (CSB)



PPLICATION ite out ways you can begin living this out today. How does this passage apply to your life? How are a going to live differently because of the truth of God's Word?	

Jerusalem was in danger. The walls desperately needed to be rebuilt and Nehemiah was distraught. Like the broken city walls, the news broke Nehemiah's heart. In response, he wept, mourned, and cried out to God. Then he acted, taking his request to King Artaxerxes, sent him to Jerusalem with the means to rebuild.

What stirs your heart? Like Nehemiah, maybe God has laid it on your heart to meet the needs of a people group, a broken-down relationship at home, the oppressed, victims of abuse, the neglected, orphans, or widows. Like Nehemiah, when God lays a need on our heart, we pray and then spring into action as the Lord leads.

PRAYER

Pray that God would show you people who are hurting that you can help. Ask God to help you be the hands and feet of Jesus to the hurt, broken, oppressed and suffering.

Read Mark 2:1-5

People filled this home in order to hear Jesus speak –but these four were on a mission to bring their friend, who was paralyzed, to Jesus. The found away around the crowd and brought their friend before Him.

That day their friend was physically healed, but more importantly, he met the Savior and received spiritual healing.

Just like the four friends, we have people around us who have needs. Who has God placed in your path that He has enabled you to help? Meeting others' physical needs often opens doors for us to point them to the One who can meet their greater spiritual need, Jesus Christ.

PRAYER

Pray that God would open your eyes to the needs of those around you and for opportunity to meet those needs and point them to Jesus.

Read 2 Kings 4:8-10

The Shunamite woman noticed Elisha's situation. First, he needed food and she was ready with a meal whenever Elisha passed through town. She also noticed that he needed a place to stay. Not only did she give him a place to stay, but she opened her home and built a room for Elisha.

We are sometimes so consumed with our own lives that we don't recognize the basic needs of others around us. God has given us material processions, not just for ourselves, but so we can bless those He places in our lives.

Be generous with what God has given you –your time, your talents and your possessions.

PRAYER

Pray that God reveal ways you can show hospitality to others. Ask Him how he wants you to use what you've been given to bless other people.

Read Matthew 25:35-40

The Apostle James, brother of Jesus and church leader in Jerusalem, sums it up another way: "Pure and undefiled religion before God the Father is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress..." (James 1:27).

Our love for God fuels our love for others. As we love Him, we are propelled into action to help those less fortunate than ourselves.

PRAYER

Pray for God to allow you to see with His eyes, so you would not rush past those who need His help, but that you would act as the Spirit leads.

These passages tell of an unlikely friendship. Jonathan, King Saul's son who is potentially in line for the throne. God's ultimate choice would be for David to be king and, surprisingly, a deep and Godly friendship forms between these two men.

Rather than be disappointed with David's rise to the throne, Jonathan embraces it! He advises, equips, counsels, and delivers David from his father's jealousy and rage.

Godly friends make us better. We draw strength and encouragement when we surround ourselves with Spirit-filled believers. We can celebrate the talents of another person when we see God at work in their lives.

PRAYER

Today, thank God for the friends He has and will use in your life.

Read Exodus 4:10-16, 17:10-13

Under God's direction they unified the Jewish people and helped the Israelites, after Pharaoh's reluctant permission (with ten plagues on the land), find freedom from Egypt.

They watched God destroy the Egyptian army in the Red Sea. Together, Prophet and Priest, they witnessed countless miracles and victories on the way to the Promised Land.

PRAYER

Ask God to stretch you this year accomplishing something extraordinary as a part of a team. Thank Him for your family, too.

We should never underestimate the impact of a Godly home. It's vital to genuinely live out our faith and demonstrate love at home. Our family knows and sees the real us.

We should ask for the Holy Spirit's help to live out Christ's truth as we reflect His grace and love to our family and others.

PRAYER

Ask God to develop a more Christ-like you, authentic to your family and friends.
